


<p><b>ENGIN 295: Communications for Engineering Leaders (Part 1) -Open for enrollment soon!</b></p> <p><i>*Course objective is for each student to hone in on their individual communication skills.</i></p>	<p><b>ENGIN 295: Communications for Engineering Leaders (Part 2)</b></p> <p><i>*Work on presentations, final reports, promotional materials, etc.</i></p>
<p><b>ENGIN 270C: Teaming &amp; Project Management - Open for enrollment soon!</b></p> <p><i>*Work on capstone deliverables.</i></p>	<p><b>ENGIN 270K: Coaching for High Performing Teams</b> (once a month for 30 min)</p> <p><i>*Share team roadblocks, any teaming dynamic issues with your coach.</i></p>
<p><b>ENGIN 296MA (2 units): Capstone</b> (Receive "IP" = In Progress at the end of semester)</p> <p><i>*6 hrs of work per week</i></p>	<p><b>ENGIN 296MB (3 units): Capstone</b> (Receive final grade)</p> <p><i>*9 hrs of work per week</i></p>

# Capstone Enrollment Units

## FALL: ENGIN 296MA = 2 units

- Each student will be hand enrolled by Fung staff in a temporary section under Prof. Anthony D. Joseph, Fung Institute Faculty Director no later than the end of August **so you will receive your 2 units of Capstone for Fall.**
- Once you are matched on a project in September, you will be dropped from your temporary section and hand enrolled by Fung staff in your correct capstone section.
- End of fall semester, you will receive an IP (In Progress).

**To ensure that Fung staff can enroll you in your required 2 units of capstone, please be sure to:**

- CLEAR any active holds on your account.
- Avoid enrolling in more than 18 units (this includes waitlisted courses).

## SPRING: ENGIN 296MB = 3 units

- Receive FINAL GRADE in Spring
  - The “IP” you receive in Fall will be automatically updated by Registrar’s office to reflect your final spring grade (this process can take 2-3 weeks after the semester has ended)

- **Aug 14 at noon PT: Students** - Submit project preferences.
  - Form will be released via 2023-24 MEng bCourses.
  - Career Team is available to help you with a Resume Tune Up. Book an appointment: [Calendar Appointment](#)
  - **Note: Students in IEOR IPES & Fintech track do not submit project preferences. They are placed on a project by their respective advisor.**
- **Aug 21: Advisors** - Preference interested students.
- **Week of Sept 5th:** Teams finalized and announced.

# Things to Consider in Project Selection

- **Ask Questions During the Info Sessions**
- **Similar to Job Process** - Partners are interviewing you and you are interviewing them
- **Student Project Ranking Form submissions** - Make sure your answers are unique
- **Consider skillset needed for the project and what you want to gain over this next year and capstone experience**
- **Multiple types of project**
  - **Partner Led** (Industry type, multiple stakeholders)
  - **Faculty** (Department, Field of Study)
  - **Student Led** (Not many but one of the most exciting)

# Capstone Policy

The expectation is that students are making informed decisions when submitting their project preferences, given the numerous resources and access to faculty, industry partners, and capstone staff during the Advisor Info Sessions and matching process. Once students have submitted their **four preferences**, they are committing to being placed in one of these projects. With that understanding, any requests to change capstone projects will not be considered after the capstone matching process has ended.

  - Watch Videos and Review Full Project Proposals (embedded link)
  - Ability to reach out to advisors and contacts to learn more and show interest.
  - Take your time and make a list of top 30 then narrow down from there to a shorter list to review in more detail.

  - Office hours with Claire & Jennifer (BearX and Capstone support).



- Please remember to **prioritize** attending your required Fall Boot Camp courses.



# What happens after the Info Sessions?

**Students submit 4 preferences using our new online system, Capstone Connect via google form.**

**Note: This process does not apply to students in IEOR Fintech & IPES concentrations.**

## **Action:**

Students' applications contain:

- A resume (1 page PDF)
- Answers to two questions:
  - What would you be able to contribute to the project based on your skills?*
  - Why are you interested in this project?*

## **Note:**

Applications are automatically forwarded to advisors for review. During the review period, advisors may reach out to students to set up interviews.
